Juneteenth marks the end of slavery in the U.S. It commemorates June 19, 1865, when Union troops arrived in Galveston, Texas, and announced that enslaved people were free, over two years after the Emancipation Proclamation.

It's the oldest known celebration of African American freedom. Juneteenth has been observed since 1866, making it a deeply rooted tradition in African American history.

Juneteenth became a federal holiday in 2021. It was officially recognized as a U.S. national holiday on June 17, 2021.

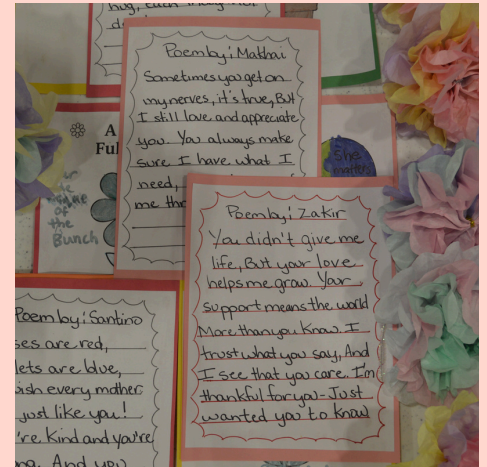
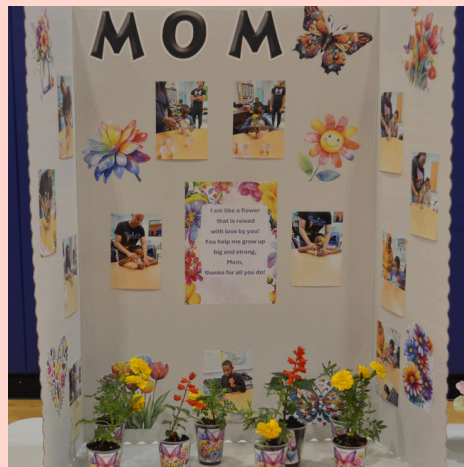
